



Crazy Spooky Love by Josie Silver

I Got Abducted by Aliens and Now I'm Trapped in a Rom-Com by Kimberly Lemming



Mate by Ali Hazelwood



Koen might be the only thing standing between her and total annihilation.




My Roommate Is a Vampire by Jenna Levine


Darkfever by Karen Marie Moning


Moon Called by Patricia Briggs


Cosmic Love at the Multiverse Hair Salon by Annie Mare


Slayer by Kiersten White


Roland Rogers Isn't Dead Yet by Samantha Allen
