



Winter Grave by Helene Tursten


Harbour Street by Ann Cleeves


A Fatal Grace by Louise Penny

Water Like a Stone by Deborah Crombie



The Family Game by Catherine Steadman



if this is part of a plan to test her loyalty or something far darker.




Secluded Cabin Sleeps Six by Lisa Unger
