




THE INEXPPLICABLE LOGIC OF MY LIFE


Suddenly Sal is throwing punches, questioning everything, and discovering that he no longer knows who he really is—but if Sal's not who he thought he was, who is he?




PIEcing ME TOGETHER

Friendships, race, privilege, identity—this compelling and thoughtful story explores the issues young women face.







by Julie Murphy






Five students who meet in freshman orientation agree to write notes to their future selves and promise to reunite in exactly four years when they are ready to graduate from high school.

by E.K. Johnston






A THOUSAND BOY KISSES






BETTER OFF FRIENDS
